Pilate asked the crowd whether they should release a murderer called Barabbas or Jesus. They chose Barabbas. The crowd shouted to crucify Jesus.		Jesus' body was laid in his own tomb, like a cave. Mary Magdalene saw Jesus standing and knew he was alive and resurrected! This day is called Easter Day.

Jesus was nailed to the cross on a hill with a sign - 'Jesus of Nazareth, King of the Jews'. Jesus died on the cross. Christians believe he was sacrificed for them.
